Martin's health took a dive at the end of February. This is what he wrote on March 9th *"For a couple of weeks, I haven't been feeling great. I am tired with little energy, have no appetite, have abdominal pain, muscular pain and generally feel terrible. After talking with my rheumatologist, Carlotta, we decided to stop my medication and see if these symptoms were caused by the treatment. But after more than two weeks I am no better"*. We sent an urgent email out and know that many of you were praying specifically for this. Martin is feeling a bit better now, with more energy but still has achy legs, a general feeling of tiredness and the muscles in his hips and legs ache. Looking at him he appears well, with rosy cheeks, but his face is flushed because of the Vasculitis.

Please continue to pray for Martin, currently he is waiting to find out the next steps in the treatment for his vasculitis. Also pray for Carlotta, his rheumatologist for wisdom as she treats him.

One of the student team in Florence writes

"The Bologna and Florence teams have been doing an outreach project called "Practising English" where we get to help university students practice their conversational English using the computer or mobile phones to converse. It has been an awesome experience and we have gotten to talk to incredible students. Simona is the student I have talked to the most. She is a second-year student studying linguistics at the University of Florence. Since our first meeting she has shared her interest in other cultures and religions. She told me that she does not believe in God, but she would like to one day find a religion that she agrees with because she sees the psychological advantages of practicing a faith. We have already read some articles together about religion, psychology and even genetics. Talking to her is an absolute joy. We are meeting next week to discuss an article about different religions from a Christian perspective and I am excited to hear her opinion. Please pray for us as we meet together".



Prayer and opportunities

Both of us have been spending more time reading our bibles and praying, than a year ago. Although the arrival of Gioia has effected that a bit!!! Most days, we have a coffee together and pray for our days, world events and our friends and families. Here are some of the answers to prayer.

- Fran organises a weekly 90-minute Zoom call for her English-speaking international friends. Over the weeks she has prayed, out loud and with permission, for friends, with others listening. She has shared her story of how and why she became a Christian a couple of times and sent WhatsApp texts containing bible verses countless times to different friends, mostly married to Italians with Italian children and grandchildren. The Lord Jesus is at work giving Fran opportunities to show His love for her friends.
- Kylie recently asked Fran “what exactly is prayer?” A brilliant question. Fran was brought up as a Catholic so as a new Christian thought prayer was “The Our Father” and “The Hail Mary”, so rote prayers. She had no idea prayer was just talking to God so could relate to Kylie’s question and empathise. They had a long conversation.

Every one of us, in this pandemic are facing trials, but as Christians Martin and I know that Jesus is with us in all our trials and that gives us hope for the future and strength for today. We continue to pray regularly for our non-Christian family and friends. We are so far away from them, but praying for our friends and family is brilliant, because it means we can still be involved in their lives. Please will you join with us that Jesus will continue to soften their hearts and we will be aware of the opportunities that He give us to have spiritual conversations.



We are praying that this Easter we will be reminded afresh of the sacrifice that Jesus made for you and me. And that we will be able to speak of the hope we have to our non believing friends, family and neighbours, particularly as our world today feels very hopeless.
